



## What is Go4schools?

Go4schools is an online school data system which gives parents and students access to:

- **Real-time attainment information** – marks and target grades for all subjects throughout the year.
- **Timetable** – Your child’s daily and weekly timetable
- **Attendance** – Shown from the start of the academic year
- **Progress Reports** – Reports are published throughout the year

After PR1 this will replace paper copies which parents have received in the past. If you are unable to access, please inform us and we will continue to provide a hard copy for you.

## How to access Go4schools

In order to log onto Go4schools you need to visit [www.go4schools.com](http://www.go4schools.com) and click on the ‘Parents’ icon in the top right hand side. Alternatively a link to Go4Schools can be found on our schools website at [www.thehazeleyacademy.com](http://www.thehazeleyacademy.com).

# Understanding your Child's report

At Hazeley we provide up to four progress reports for your child each academic year. We call these PR1, PR2, PR3 and PR4.

\*Year 7 and 8 will only have to reports.

## How to read a PR

MAG stands for minimum attainable grade. This is calculated from your child's grades at primary school. In 6<sup>th</sup> form the MAG is calculated based on their GCSE results. In years 7 and 8 the MAG is called a Target and it's what they're expected to achieve at the end of year 8. The maths target is based on their KS2 maths score, English on their KS2 reading score and all other subjects are an average of the 2. In year 9 they are given a grade to achieve by the end of their GCSEs in yr11. This explains why it may look like your child is off track in yr9 and 10, the work they do is judged against what we want them to have achieved by the end of year 11.

WAG stands for working at grade. It is arrived at from calculations of relevant assessments.

FOG stands for forecast grade. It represents what the teachers think your child will achieve when they sit their GCSE.

TAG stands for target grade and it one grade higher than the MAG

Attitude to learning is a score based on their standard of classwork, homework, general attitude to studies, uniform, timekeeping, equipment and behaviour.

Comments are written when the teacher has put a FOG that is below MAG. The comment should give your child an area to work on that will help raise their WAG by the next PR.

One report a year will be a Main PR. This means your child will get a comment from every subject and their form tutor.

#### Number and Letters

You may be wondering why your child has now got number grades instead of letters. A new grading structure is being rolled out over the next 3 years, numbers 9-1 are replacing letter A-G. At Hazeley we break them down further by + and -. This is a staggered roll out with only English and Maths using the new system in year 11. BTEC courses are unaffected by the new grading structure. They are given a MAG in year 9 to achieve by the end of year 11.
