To be successful students will need to be able to:

All assessments are graded Pass, Merit or Distinction.

- **Unit 1: Human Lifespan Development** - 1h 30minute exam, marked out of 90.
- **Unit 2: Working in Health and Social Care** - 1h 30minute exam, marked out of 80.
- **Unit 4: Enquiries into Current Research in Health and Social Care**- Externally set research task with a supervised 3 hour assessment.

The external assessments are worth 46% of the overall grade.

All other units are coursework which are marked internally and moderated externally by Pearson.

What can I do to support my child at home?

- Assist learners in finding an appropriate work experience placement and support their attendance
- Purchase core text books and revision guides
- Encourage students to carry out wider reading on topics covered in class, additional reading will be provided on Google Classroom
