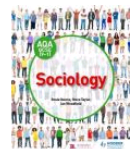

To be successful students will need to be able to:

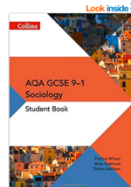

Communicate with the subject teacher (through email) with any concerns. Practise past paper exam questions with your child (AQA website) and use the mark scheme to check on answers.
