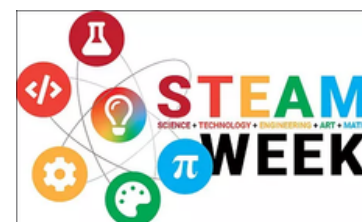
Year 7 - Anglian Water Event

Students were also able to develop their team working skills further by undertaking timed Lego challenges before attending a careers fair to discover STEM related career opportunities.
