Dear Parent/Carer

We hope you are all safe and well. Although the online learning has been a real success, I am sure our students are ready to return to school and continue with face-to-face learning. We are really looking forward to welcoming students back from the 8th March.

You will be receiving a separate communication regarding the testing process for your child's return, it is very important that you read the letter as it will detail when your son/daughter will be tested and confirm when they are returning to school.

The information below should remind you of our key routines and procedures to ensure we can make a smooth and safe return.

Uniform

Students must return to school in full uniform – please refer to the uniform guide on the Academy website - The Hazeley Academy - Uniform (Years 7 to 11). There will be a continued focus on ventilation within all rooms in the school, with all windows being open to support this, so please think carefully about additional layers on colder days. Students will be able to wear a coat in the classroom at the teacher's discretion. You will have received a communication regarding uniform click and collect (the possibility to donate and swap uniform if it is now too small).

Masks

Facemasks must now be worn at all times in school. Obviously, students will need to remove their mask to eat at break or lunch time, but they will be expected to replace it as soon as they have finished. **We recommend that they have two masks with them each day**, to support having to wear it at all times. Please could they be provided with a small sandwich style bag to put their mask in when they have to remove it for eating/drinking.

Additional Routines

Students should still maintain social distancing as much as possible. During break, lunch and travelling to and from school, students are to avoid being within 1 metre of others. We know that when students first see friends on their return, they may wish to give them a hug/shake hands etc but they should please avoid unnecessary contact.

We will continue to use our track and trace system so students will need to be prepared to identify 'close contacts' they may have had each day. They will need to do this for all lessons, break and lunch time.
