We are thrilled to announce that the library is back, bursting with books and better than ever! The library is a welcoming space for students to lose themselves in a good book or to work independently. 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Within the school day, Y7 to Y9 take part in the Accelerated Reader programme and will have an English lesson in the library once a fortnight. When the library is not being used for Accelerated Reader sessions, it is open at break and lunch times so that students can come and return, reissue or choose a book to read – if the sign outside is green, then this means it we are open!

After school, the library is available for students in all year groups to read, quiz or work on their homework independently until 4.15pm. We love to make our library a peaceful and purposeful space, so students should make sure they have plenty of work to keep them busy when they're with us after school. We look forward to seeing our students back and sharing what they've been reading!

PE Kit updates and reminders

Students are to wear their PE kit to school on the days they have PE. If they do not have PE but are taking part in a club after school, they need to bring their kit to school and get changed after 3.15pm. If the lessons are:

- Inside- there will be no need to change
- Outside but stay dry- there will be no need to change
- Outside and in the event they get wet/dirty- Students may need to change into spare clothes which match the Hazeley PE kit. (Plain white t-shirt, plain black shorts, socks, and trainers.) This means that if they get wet, they can change into warm, dry clothing and be comfortable in the remaining lessons.

V2 Grid Road

Twice weekly testing at home - New test kits

We have home testing kits to be provided to your child, to enable them to continue testing throughout September. Please note that the new tests are nasal only testing kits. Full instructions are provided in the box. If you have the previous testing kits at home you are still able to use these, using them as instructed (nasal and throat swab)

At Hazeley we love routine, so we suggest getting into a pattern of testing on Sunday night/ Monday morning and Wednesday night/ Thursday morning. On Monday and Thursday morning, Tutors will be asking if testing has been completed and we will have a small testing site available in R2L during form time on these mornings should anyone need to complete their test in school. This is vital to make sure we keep the school community as safe as possible. Please find updated guidance from MK Council for Parents/Carers regarding suspected or confirmed cases attached to the main email.
