We would ask that to support keeping the community safe that you limit attendance to one parent per student and that you both take a lateral flow test prior to attending.


Year 11 - Study hub

Updates

Testing over October half term.

The current advice from the Government is students should continue to test twice – weekly over the half term and take a Lateral Flow Test the night before they return to the Academy after the break. Your child will be bringing home another set of testing kits from school today.

Covid procedures for the new half term

We would like all students and staff to return in November with reusable face coverings, these are still being worn in communal areas unless they have exemptions. We will also for the first week back continue the twice weekly testing in school and then review the impact of the half term on the number of cases within school.



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Covid vaccinations

These will take place on Tuesday 9th November and are <u>for students aged 12 –15 only</u> on this date. Therefore, some Y7 and Y11 are outside this criterion. Please do not complete the form if your child is aged 11 or 16 (as of the 9th November).

Any parent who wishes to have their child vaccinated on this date must fill in the E consent form (found in the letter linked below) by 5pm on the 4th November 2021. As a school we are merely hosting the location of this event therefore we do not have access to this form, so any consents after this time and date will not be used and your child will not be vaccinated. If you have any queries concerning this, please liaise directly with the medical team on the phone number listed on the letter found here <u>Vaccination Letter incl consent form</u>.

The Secretary of State for Education and the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care have written a joint letter to parents about the vaccination of children aged 12 to 15 and the importance of continuing with twice-weekly COVID-19 testing and reporting. Alongside the letter are some <u>frequently answered questions for parents</u>, from Dr Mary Ramsay, Head of Immunisation. A copy of the letter is <u>available to download</u>

Curriculum update

We have been updating our website so that it reflects the hard work that our subject leaders have been doing throughout the pandemic to improve the curriculum that we deliver to our students. You will find some new documentation on the subject curriculum pages that will hopefully help you to understand the learning journey your child is on.

The curriculum plans give a detailed breakdown of the content in each unit, broken down into knowledge and skills to be learned and developed. Those under the Core heading will lead to secure outcomes for students. Those under Hinterland are the concepts that add the richness to our curriculum, provide context or a wider understanding of the subject and aim to provide further interest and excitement about the subject.

The curriculum journey documents are also displayed in classrooms and aim to give an understanding of how each unit of the curriculum fits into the wider picture of your child's learning. We also want them to give a sense of the connections between the different units studied and how they are building on their previous learning. We would welcome constructive feedback on this new documentation and how we can make it more accessible.

Red stamps

Please spend some time over the break looking at your son/daughter's planner and praise the collection of stamps and lack of behaviour codes. Where you see a red stamp – this is when they have done something 'over and above' in the lesson. They are hard to come by and we never give them out to whole classes. If you see them, please acknowledge it. Starting next term, we are introducing Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum certificates to recognise students' monumental efforts in lessons.
