# Important message - Online Safety

There is currently a national trend taking place whereby teachers and staff are being rated and abused online. Sadly, Milton Keynes is no different with TikTok accounts being created for many local schools where teachers and staff are being subjected to what is, at a minimum, hurtful content, to others being openly abused. We are working with TikTok to have the content removed but would advise those following the accounts to consider the impact they are having on their teachers by viewing, sharing and therefore encouraging some of this content. As a school we tried to go over and above during lockdown to support those in our community, for some of the videos and messages produced to be used in this fashion is hugely disappointing and certainly not in the Hazeley spirit. <u>TikTok Parent/Carer Need to know</u>

We feel strongly that the diversity and differences in our community make us richer while the consistency of our uniform and dress code bring us together.



As the weather becomes colder and we maintain the ventilation in classrooms we are encouraging students to wear multiple layers of clothing. # **Curriculum Focus: Art**

In the first of our curriculum subject series, we are going to focus on one of our Creativity subjects.

Art is a consistently popular subject at GCSE and A level amongst our students and we start this in Years 7 and 8 by developing students understanding and use of the elements of design through a range of 2D and 3D experiences. Art as a subject develops not just fine motor skills, an eye for detail but also how to research and analyse, work with independence and how to think laterally, all of which are transferable skills. The department also reaches out into the Academy Community through displays and support for cultural events such as Diwali and Remembrance Day. The Art Ambassador scheme introduced over lockdown empowers senior students to support students in Art in lower year groups and the blended learning scheme means students select from a range of online experiences and then review and report back to their peers on it. We are already Artsmark Gold accredited and are in the application process of moving this to platinum, something we can do due to our involvement in initiatives outside of school such as MAKE (Milton Keynes Art Education) and the MK Cultural Festival. We are passionate about the part that Art plays in providing students with Cultural Capital and promoting their Creativity and its use in all areas.
