It is with deep sorrow that I share the tragic news of the death of Ruby Deeks, a daughter, a sister, a family member, a friend and wonderful Y10 Hazeley student.

Ruby was struck by a car on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> April and airlifted to John Radcliffe Hospital, but sadly died on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April.

I am sure like me your thoughts and condolences are with Ruby's family and friends. She was a truly marvellous young person, bright, kind and caring. She used her energy and voice to help others as an active member of our school council, she will be deeply missed, but never forgotten.

Ruby's family wanted to pass on the news that her organs have been donated and in doing so possibly saved the lives of at least five other young people and her eyes will allow others to see again. They also wanted all of us to share the message of crossing roads carefully, helping prevent a recurrence of this tragedy.

As a school we will try to support our community with assemblies and additional pastoral support.
