Students and staff are making good use of our memorial garden, we have strongly advised our students to congregate here and avoid the spot where the accident happened as this could lead to further risk. Ruby's parents have been very clear of their desire for other young people to learn from this tragedy and for us all to be more vigilant in relation to road safety.

Ruby's funeral is being planned for Tuesday 17th May at Crownhill. There will be a limited number of places and any students intending to go should email Miss Cooke, ECooke@thehazeleyacademy.com who is going to liaise with the family to make sure that there are enough spaces, and that other arrangements are in place.

We are starting to plan a further event later in the term, this will allow those not able to attend the funeral to share their respects and grieve while also promoting key messages around road safety, supporting each other through and celebrating life. It will also have a fund-raising element to support the charities which have helped Ruby's family. This will be shaped by Ruby's family and friends, details will follow.

Thank you again for supporting your child and our community through this sad time in a way that honours the wishes of Ruby and her family and creates a legacy that Ruby, her family, and our community can be proud of.

DEAR Day




