The benefits of cycling to school

At Hazeley we encourage all of our students to think about health, wellbeing and the environment and in particular their mode of transport to school. We recently did a survey of students and how many cycled, walked or came by car or bus. 504 students come to school by car (based on the most recent survey).

On average there's 221.4 grams of carbon burned per mile (to cycle 1 mile it takes 7 mins, to walk it takes 19 mins). The statistics below are based on the 504 students if they travelled one mile to school by car:

- Per day that's 446,342 grams of carbon burnt
- Per week 2,231,725 grams of carbon burnt
- Per month 8,926,900 grams of carbon burnt
- Per term 15,622,075 grams of carbon burnt
- Per year 46,866,225 grams of carbon burnt

It is incredible to think that amount of carbon is being burnt just from the school run (AM and PM.) More children cycling or walking to school means that there is less traffic on the roads. This reduces the emissions, which therefore reduces damage to the environment. Traffic around schools can be a problem so encouraging more children to cycle to school reduces congestion directly around the school.

MK Foodbank

The MK Food Bank are doing a new campaign called Big Doorstep Give, which they are running to build up depleted food stocks due to the current cost of living crisis where they are currently seeing a rise in food bank users at 35 new households per week.
