The Role of the Queen



- The Queen was Head of the Church of England. She appointed Bishops and Archbishops on the advice of the Prime Minister.
- The Queen was Head of the Armed Forces. She was the only person who can declare and end war with other countries.



The Queen was Head of the Commonwealth and has made more than 200 trips abroad to visit Commonwealth countries.

She also worked with more than 600 charities.

State Funeral



The state funeral will be held at Westminster Abbey.

There will be two minutes' silence across the nation.

After the one-hour service, a large ceremonial procession will accompany the coffin to Hyde Park, where it will be transferred from gun carriage to state hearse and travel to Windsor.

After a procession through Windsor, a committal service will be held at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, during which the coffin will be lowered into the royal vault, before being buried in the King George VI memorial chapel, located inside St George's Chapel.
