

Keep Britain Tidy has also teamed up with plastic processing experts Milspeed on a ground-breaking project to develop the large-scale recycling of fishing nets in the UK. Each year, it is estimated that 640,000 tonnes of fishing nets end up as plastic waste in our oceans. These nets can continue to 'ghost fish' for up to 600 years, with countless fish, dolphins and seals killed after getting trapped in them.
