Year 7 and 8 - 5Cs Passport

Years 7 and 8 are now well underway with the activities in the 5Cs Passport including volunteering, enrichment, geography, Duke of Edinburgh, metacognition, and oracy. Some students are already approaching completion of some sections in the first term even though the completion date isn't until July 2023. It is wonderful to see such enthusiasm to new opportunities. The benefits of volunteering in general are well-researched and vast. Here are a few that apply to our young people: developing life skills to transition into adult life including empathy, working hard, and problem solving, higher levels of both self-efficacy and self-esteem and as psychologist Albert Bandura explains, "Perceived self-efficacy refers to beliefs in one's capabilities to organize and execute the courses of action required to manage prospective situations." In other words, self-efficacy is believing we can do what needs to be done to handle a situation effectively. It's a big cause of motivation and it influences how we think and act.
