#### **Year Group Messages**

#### Year 7 - Without a Trace Trip

A very exciting opportunity for our Y7 students that will participate in outdoor activities with Parks Trust, at Hazeley Woods, on the 27th of June. These activities will relate to reducing our carbon print allowing contact with nature and links to science curriculum. Students will be building dens, natural water filters, and learning how to light a fire.

#### Year 7 and 8 - 5Cs Passport

Years 7 and 8 have been working on their 5Cs Passport this year and the deadline for completion is Friday 16 June. The aim of the passport is to support our vision of the 5Cs, support life skills, careers, and build confidence and resilience. # Year 8 - Vaccinations - Tuesday 27th June 2023

Year 8 students are invited to have their first HPV vaccination as part of their NHS childhood immunisation schedule. This vaccination protects against the HPV virus that can cause cervical cancer, some mouth & throat cancers as well as cancer of the anus and genital areas. #### Medication

All medication that comes into the academy, whether it is prescribed by a doctor or an "over the counter" medication must be handed in to the Academy Matron (Miss Winkfield), Reception or Student Services which will then be passed to Miss Winkfield.

Prescribed medication must arrive in its original packaging with the student's name on the dispensary label and a **green form** must be signed by a parent giving us authorisation, instructions, and storage details for us to be able to administer the medication.

Medication that is purchased over the counter i.e., for hay fever or migraines, must be sent in its original packaging. A **pink form** must be signed by a parent giving us authorisation, instructions, and storage details for us to be able to administer the medication.

If these forms are not completed the student will not be permitted to have the medication.

No medication is to be carried on a students' person unless it is an inhaler, auto-injector, or diabetic medication, without prior authorisation. All medication brought into the Academy and passed to Miss Winkfield will be kept in individual medi-wallets personalised with the student's name, form and description of the meds and a copy of the permission to administer form and be kept in the medicine cabinet in the medical room.
