# Milton Keynes Hospital Trust Victory – Miss Jelley



What does the MK Hospital Trust say about what they do?

# MK Young Carers

## Enigma – Mr Nwaolise



- Young carers are 8-19 year olds caring for a family member with a physical or mental illness, a disability, or a drug or alcohol related problem. The person being cared for may be a parent, sibling or other relative living in the same household.

MK Young Carers support in a number of ways:

- regular clubs and activities
- one-to-one support where needed
- someone to talk to who understands
- targeted group work
- information, advice and signposting
- opportunity to meet with other young carers
- support in schools



# RSPCA Cobra

- Every year thousands of animals suffer from neglect, cruelty and abuse. The RSPCA works to end their misery. The RSPCA rely on voluntary fundraising and donations to carry out their vital work.
- Through investigations and prosecutions, the RSPCA stand up to those who deliberately harm animals to send out a clear message - we will not tolerate animal abuse. Highly trained officers tackle neglect and cruelty on every level working to stamp out animal cruelty.



# Non-uniform day

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- Appropriate clothing – no short skirts, bare midriffs or shoulders shown eg – strappy tops.
- If you have PE lessons, clothing should be suitable for sports.
- No hoop or large earrings – this is a safety issue as they can get accidentally caught e.g. in a corridor.
- No hats, hoods worn up or headwear.
- Respectful behaviour throughout the day.
