## Important updates

#### ICT Acceptable Use

We would like to remind you of a few key procedures that are found within our ICT Acceptable Use policy, to help prevent the overload of the IT systems. This will ensure the smooth running of the day and the potential disruption to any learning.

Please be reminded that students are not allowed to access the IT network with their own personal device, with the exception of Sixth Form. Any unauthorised access to the network is prohibited.

There are some points in the ICT Acceptable Policy that we would like to draw your attention to:

• I will report any accidental access to, or receipt of inappropriate materials, or filtering breach to the Network Manager or Trust IT Director.

- I will not allow unauthorised individuals to access email / Internet / intranet / network.
- Students are not permitted to use staff laptops.
- I will not install any unauthorised software or connect unauthorised hardware or devices to the school's network.
- I will not gain or attempt to gain access to restricted areas of the network, or to any password-protected information, without approval from authorised personnel.

• I will not set up any software, applications or web services on the school's network without approval by authorised personnel, or creating or using any programme, tool or item of software designed to interfere with the functioning of the school's ICT facilities, accounts or data.

#### **Pupil premium**


With the increase in the cost of living, we want to make sure as many eligible students as possible are claiming their free school meals. Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance

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- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If you think your child is eligible for Free School Meals, an application can be made to the school via this link: <u>Online</u> <u>FSM Application (cloudforedu.org.uk)</u>

# Year 11 Parents Evening
