What will I learn?

The aim of the Level 3 Diploma in Health and Social care is to provide learners with a greater understanding of the sector in which they wish to enter. There is space for additional subjects studied to offer a breadth or focus to their program of study. The design of the course is to help learners build high-level skills such as teamwork, creative thinking, and presentation skills. It helps to develop independent research and study skills that are essential for success at university. Finally, it has been designed with a clear purpose to support defined progression routes into higher education or employment.

How will I be assessed?

Paper 1: Human Lifespan Development. 1 hour and 30 minutes

Paper 2: Working in Health and Social Care. 1 hour and 30 minutes.

Paper 3: Enquiries into Current Research in Health and Social Care. 3 hours.

Coursework: 5 units of coursework will be completed across the two years.

You will need a minimum of a Grade 4 in English Language. Even though it is not essential for previous study of Health and Social Care at level 2, it is desired.

What will I need to bring to lessons?

You will need to bring an interest in Health and Social care. You should be a person who has a wish to enter the Health and Social care environment with the aspiration of someday working in the sector.
