Focus on... Chemistry By Mr Rowlingson


Something to Read:

Young Enterprise Update

Young Enterprise (YE) allows students to set up and run their own businesses. Our 2020 Young Enterprise cohort has been memorable for several reasons; the participation rate of 4 teams of over 50 students has been the highest recorded, and students have had the opportunity to showcase their creativity and initiative. The enthusiasm has been unrivalled. Imaginations have been expressed. Creativity has been shown in the diverse range of products: sign language books, battery chargers, mythical card games and key finders. The "Hands Up" sign language book and "Decked Out" card game have both been borne out of the students' own imagination. Products have been researched and sourced from far away shores. The entrepreneurial flair of the students was never more obvious than at the YE Trade Far on a cold January Sunday morning in Middleton Hall. Our students stood out with their unbounded enthusiasm and determination.

Each of the four teams managed their own affairs, supported by business advisors. YE 2020 teams continued to work virtually after lockdown culminating in two notable successes. "Quip & Keep" won the area final and proceeded to be awarded 'Best Product Design' in the East of England regional finals for their sign language book which they created, illustrated and produced themselves. The book will be stocked in the gift shop of the Milton Keynes Museum, and has won the praise of the audiology department at Milton Keynes University Hospital.

Young Enterprise 2020 at The Hazeley Academy has been a memorable year and all of the participants have gained a great deal of experience. I am looking forward to welcoming the next cohort in September!
