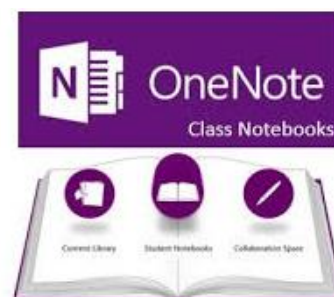

It has emerged that students need a central place where they can take notes and complete tasks. We are trialling a function called 'Class Notebook' in Microsoft Teams. Class Notebooks have a personal workspace for every student, a content library for handouts and a collaboration space for lessons and creative activities. 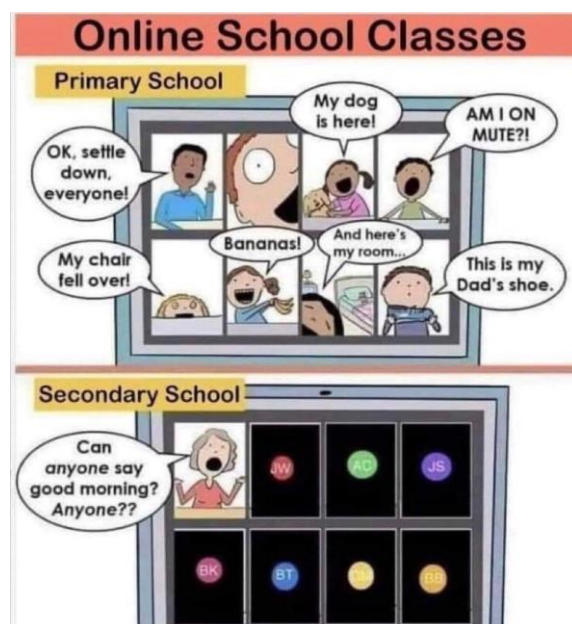
Hello From The Other side...

One of the challenges that teachers are facing whilst teaching online is student's reluctance to speak on during live lessons as they prefer to type in the chatbox. Class discussion is essential for learning as it helps students process information rather than passively receiving it. We are encouraging students to interact online similar to how they interact in class. However, it is understandable that talking online is awkward.

Some strategies we are using:

- Fun icebreakers
- Questions and quizzes
- Paired and group work, sometimes using breakout rooms
- Show and tell
- Feedback and sharing of work
- Discussion and debate

If you notice things are a little quiet, please encourage your child to interact to get the most out of their lessons.
