

YOUR HISTORY JOURNEY – KEY STAGE FOUR

Our KS4 is the most accessible and engaging selection that we feel AQA has to offer. We commit to the Twentieth Century in early years in order to continue with building the Schema from Y8. Elizabeth and Health are connective to Y7, and more challenging. Our KS4 seeks to help students to access our A-Level units in terms of closely aligned History, but not repetitive. Careers sessions on Law and History beyond KS4 help students to see the specific value of History as well as the more nuanced.

We estimate that we'll finish Year Eleven in March, here we will engage in bespoke revision for each class according to needs.

This continues the thematic study, observing the Early Modern and the Modern Periods up until the present day. We continue in developing change, continuity, causation and consequence, similarity and difference as well as significance, and handling source.

For the summer term of Year Ten, we pause to revise in preparation for PPEs, which then develops into a through DIRT cycle and the preparation of revision routines for the final academic year.

This focuses on the first two periods of Health and the People – the Medieval and the Renaissance Periods. We'll explore the causes of change and continuity, as well as the significance of different discoveries and individuals. Handling sources is a key skills developed too in the 'How Useful' question.
