This is underscored with collaborative learning and effective communication skills, recognising the importance of interpersonal skills in the field of psychology. The foundation of our intent is that, by delivering an enriching and impactful psychology curriculum, students will be better prepared for the world of work, having honed skills and self-awareness that allow them to be the best version of themselves.
